Licensed Full Time Therapist

Position Description:

Under the direction of the Executive Director and Clinical Director, the Licensed Full Time Therapist plans and effectively administers therapeutic services for the counseling program. This includes responsibility for seeing individual, couples and families on-site for therapy sessions, administering psychological assessments for adults and children, providing workshops on- and off-site to members of the community, leading therapy groups on- and off-site, and providing weekly supervision to fellow staff members.

Site Description:

Cornerstone Counseling Center of Chicago (CCCOC) is a full service psychological and counseling agency located just north of the Loop in Chicago. CCCOC's staff are Master's and Doctoral level Christian professionals. CCCOC strives to reflect Christ's model as the Great Physician and serve as an agent of healing, providing psychotherapy, training, seminars and assessments to the adults, couples, children, adolescents, families, groups, churches and schools of all income levels of our local community. The Center provides traditional 50-minute therapy sessions on-site, off-site group counseling and training seminars.

Major Responsibilities:

- Maintain a minimum of 20 hours of client sessions each week.
- Keep all relevant records up to date and perform clinical tasks.
- Provide psychological assessments and testing for adults and children.
- Provide weekly supervision to student staff members and immediate supervision for staff dealing with crisis clients.
- Research topics and provide workshops and/or seminars for staff and members of the community.
- Attend weekly staff meetings and staff trainings.
- Conduct off-site school groups in CPS Title-I private schools and at partnering community organizations.
- Conduct administrative duties as necessary to further the mission of CCCOC.

Qualifications:

- 3+ years of prior clinical experience
- Licensed Clinical Psychologist or LCPC/LCSW/LMFT licensure
- Excellent interpersonal, leadership and problem solving skills.
- Ability to work as both a leader and a member of a team.
- Maintains relevant current knowledge of the field by participation in training sessions, seminars and conferences.
- Is open and respectful of cultural and socioeconomic characteristics of clients and is willing and competent to work with a diverse client population.
- Demonstrated clinical skills and clinical supervision skills.
- Demonstrated ability to comprehend and accommodate the mission and vision of CCCOC.
- Experience or ability to use computers for data entry, communication and report writing.

Clients and Services:

Cornerstone Counseling Center of Chicago serves a diverse clientele in terms of age, race, SES and presenting problem. In FY08-09, the Center saw 271 clients weekly or bi-weekly on-site, and 476 clients off-site in school and after-school group counseling.

The majority of on-site clients are between the ages of 18-45 and are of diverse socio-economic, ethnic and religious backgrounds.. Payment options for on-site clients include PPO and some HMO insurance, full fee, and sliding fee scale. Services are available on-site in both English and Spanish.

Cornerstone staff lead psycho educational groups in school and after school programs in over 22 Chicago neighborhoods in CPS Title-I private schools and community organizations. Students range from K-12th grades, majority African-American (78%) and SES under \$49,999 (72%). Groups are led on topics including healthy relationship skills, domestic violence, and anger management.

Cornerstone staff lead a broad range of seminars and trainings for individuals, schools, churches, businesses and community organizations, helping to share relevant information on topics such as abuse, grief, classroom management, addictions, relationships, stress management, vocational concerns and parenting.
